Low Cost, High Reliability & Performance = Lots of Use

From new boat launch until Bill's Marine Service pulled boat for winter storage on 19 October 2005, Larry and I put 972 miles and 69.3 hours on motor, 167 gallons of gas totaling \$430.

JONPOT cruises easily at 25mph with three folks plus all their stuff!

Larry & I made 14 round trips to Two Rivers to dine. Two Rivers is 10 miles north, from my Granville hovel on river bank at River Mile 99 across from WVU Coliseum, thru Point Marion lock. Round trip time including dinner is 4 hours.

We made 6 round trips 35 miles north thru Point Marion and Grays Landing locks to Maxwell L/D, then, had lunch at Riviera Restaurant in Fredericktown PA. Round trip time plus lunch 6-7 hours!

We made 5 round trips to Woods Boathouse on Tygart in Fairmont WV, 30 miles south thru Morgantown, Hildebrand, and Opekiska locks. Round trip time 5-7 hours.

Many dock-and-dine restaurants north of Point Marion L/D. NONE south!

BUT!! Thanks to a federal Boating Infrastructure Grant (BIG), we will have docks at McQuain Riverfront Park in Morgantown, spring 2006, which will help with access to local restaurants! These BIG funds also will improve the great dock now at Star City, and allow folks to dine at nearby restaurants!

And, in 2007, the Platinum Properties "Waterfront Marina" docks just north of the Radisson Hotel should be open!!
